



The second section takes you along the Rehberger Graben water-transport ditch.

The hiking tour connects both sections and takes you to the Oderteich pond.

For all the parts of the tour there are audio guides available.

The audio guide is a guided tour with sound.

The audio guide will explain the installations of the Water Management System to you.

You can play the audio guide on your smartphone.

To do this, you must download the app from the company Hearonymus.

Then you must scan the QR code in this leaflet for one of the languages.

Three language versions are available:

- German
- English

We recommend that people with movement limitations use the paths with an accompanying person.

WELCOME TO THE UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE IN THE HARZ!

You are in one of the oldest mining areas in Europe.

The Upper Harz Water Management System is part of this historic heritage.

It is the largest interconnected sustainable energy system in the world.

Its visible components in the landscape are ponds, water-transport ditches and water tunnels.

Some of these are part of the water management system of Sankt Andreasberg.

The system of Sankt Andreasberg includes:

- Grube Samson mine
- Hilfe-Gottes Teich pond
- Rehberger Graben ditch
- Oderteich pond

You can explore these places on the World Heritage Insight Walk „Water power – past and present“.

The walk has two sections.

But you can also do both sections as one long walk.

The first section is a circuit around the Hilfe-Gottes Teich pond.

Five interactive stations with information in easy language enable lots of people to experience the Insight Walk.

SECTION 1: CIRCUIT AROUND THE HILFE-GOTTES TEICH POND

Come on an interesting walk around the Hilfe-Gottes Teich pond.

On the way you will learn about how water power provides energy.

- Length of the walk: 600 metres
- Walking time: 15 minutes
- Total time: 40 minutes

- Type of path: Few obstacles, partly asphalted, short uphill sections

SECTION 2: PATH ALONG THE REHBERGER GRABEN DITCH

This path will take you from the old Sonnenberger Graben ditch along the Rehberger Graben ditch to the Rehberger Grabenhaus.

You will find out about the construction and use of the water transport ditch that goes to Sankt Andreasberg.

- Length of the walk: 700 metres
- Walking time: 15 minutes
- Total time: 30 minutes
- Difficulty: easy
- Type of path:
Asphalted, no uphill sections
