They provide an overview of the numerous museums and publicly-accessible historic landscape features that are spread over an area of 200 square kilometres. The UNESCO World Heritage in the Harz is one of the most diverse UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Germany.

The World Heritage Information Centres are your ideal starting point for discovering the original settings in the World Heritage. They offer you a wealth of information on what is available for tourists and present the World Heritage locations near to the respective Information Centre in more detail. We are pleased to invite you to visit the World Heritage Information Centres in Walkenried, Goslar and Clausthal-Zellerfeld before you set off on your journey of discovery through the World Heritage.

Short exhibition tour

At first, you approach World Heritage from a global perspective: Discover the importance of the worldwide UNESCO World Heritage Sites as the mutual cultural awareness of mankind and find out about the criteria under which the UNESCO World Heritage in the Harz was adopted into the World Heritage List. The Harz World Heritage ensemble is regarded as a masterpiece of human achievement and in a particular period of human history had a decisive influence on technical and cultural development as well as shaping the landscape.

The content of the exhibition is presented in an interesting way through touch-displays and graphical presentations. An impressive photo wall demonstrates the relationships between the well-known and less-known World Heritage locations and the World Heritage in the Harz. Portrait photos of people from around the world make clear that World Heritage is the property of everyone and connects people with each other across borders.

Multimedia journey through 3000 years of cultural history

The exhibition continues with a regional look at the World Heritage and mining region Harz with its more than 3000 years of cultural history. Architecture and settlements, mining, changing landscapes and water management – all these themes are directly connected.



Discover the diversity of the World Heritage

Be amazed at which buildings, landscape features and water engineering systems, both above and below ground are part of the World Heritage ensemble in the Harz. These include the underground and above-ground installations at the Rammelsberg and the Historic Town of Goslar, which was heavily influenced by mining.

You can discover further elements of the World Heritage in the Upper Harz Water Management System around Clausthal-Zellerfeld with its more than 300 km pond and ditch system, at Grube Samson mine in St. Andreasberg, the Monastery at Walkenried, the 19-Lachter-Stollen in Wildemann, Knesebeck Shaft in Bad Grund as well as the Ottiliae Shaft and Kaiser Wilhelm II Shaft in Clausthal-Zellerfeld.

The highlight of the World Heritage Information Centres emphasizes the interplay between nature, culture and technology: a 3D landscape model with a seven-minute film projection presents you with a birds-eye overview of the entire World Heritage in the Harz, its underground dimensions and centuries of history.

Taking a local perspective the focus is on the World Heritage locations in the immediate vicinity of the World Heritage Information Centres. In Walkenried these are Walkenried Monastery, directly

opposite the Information Centre, Grube Samson mine in St. Andreasberg and the Oderteich pond in the middle of the Harz National Park. In Goslar, the Rammelsberg Mine, the Historic Town of Goslar with its Imperial Palace and historic Town Hall as well as the Auerhahn Cascade are presented in more detail. In Clausthal-Zellerfeld the regional focus is on the complex system of ponds, ditches and tunnels of the Upper Harz Water Management System. Audio stations vividly explain what you can discover there.

With your individual roadmap through the World Heritage

Before you start your journey through the authentic World Heritage locations, you can put together your own individual route using a media terminal. It offers a lot of information on what is available for tourists and provides an overview of current events. Whether possible activities for bad weather, barrier-free locations or events for the whole family – you can decide. You can print out your own "roadmap" or load it digitally onto your smartphone.
